“ I am so sad about Darren's death. I miss him so much. He was my friend. Always smiling always helpful and always friendly. He was always playing pranks on me... the most frequent one was sneaking my pallet Jack away from where I left it so when I needed it to move a pallet, which was usually in a time sensitive situation, I would turn around and it would be 50 feet away. The funny thing about it was that I never, not once, caught him doing it. I caught him a couple times as he was reaching for the handle, but never sneaking it away. He had me laughing every single time. The week of his death, I worked with him at the stitcher, and he was not his usual self... I was worried that I had offended him in some way so I straight up asked him if I had. He assured me I hadn't and that he was alright. I told him I loved him and that if he needed to talk about anything that he could talk to me if he wanted. He just said okay. That was on Tuesday, and I never saw him again. On August 30th, I was feeling silly at work and made a short video that I sent to my daughter about what I do at work... after Darren died I wondered if he might have been in that video, and he was. It is a small thing, but he blows me a kiss, after he picks up an ad off the floor. For me, it was his way of saying goodbye, maybe he meant it for all of us.
