Larry Ray Mussman, 79, fell asleep in death on June 20, 2023, at his home in Broken Arrow, Oklahoma. He was born January 31, 1944, in Guymon, Oklahoma. Larry was the eighth child of fifteen children, born to Fred Albert and Pearl Lahoma Mussman.

Larry made his home in Buffalo, Oklahoma, where his four children were born. In about 1985, he moved to San Jose, California. In 2006, Larry relocated to the Tulsa area to be closer to family.
