Leo Thomas Compton was born on March 25th, 1934 in Kingfisher, Oklahoma.

It was clear even from his younger years, when he rode motorcycles and dune buggies, that Leo

loved life and loved adventure. That love took him many places. From his early days of farming

in Watonga and the time he spent in Germany, to when he moved to LA and began his career

with Southwestern Bell.

When his life brought him back to Oklahoma, he added to these adventures by raising 7

children, rebuilding Volkswagens, and caring for horses, cows, and chickens.

When he found

himself living on the shores of Grand Lake, he became quite the fisherman.

Countless times he

buried a barrel in mud and would noodle a 60 lb catfish with his bare hands.

have stood around a fish fryer with him as he told stories, laughed, and fried delicious fish.

On July 10th of 1982, Leo made one of the most important decisions he would ever make when

he dedicated his life to Jehovah. Afterwards he went on to serve as an elder

and because of his  
love for Jehovah and zeal to help others come to know him, Leo took early  
retirement from  
Southwestern Bell to become a full-time minister. He continued to serve  
Jehovah faithfully for  
the rest of his life.
