Vorise Joseph Lightell "Big Daddy" was born December 5, 1979 in New Orleans Louisiana to Arthur Thomas Lightell Sr and Joyce Anne Chartin. He passed away Monday August 10, 2020 in Tulsa Oklahoma. He was 40.

He was a member of the Chitimacha Tribe of Louisiana and an artist in the National Museum of Native American Art at the Smithsonian Institute. He was also a poet, lyricist, musician and self taught on guitar, mandolin and harmonica.

He was an author of Children's stories. He also represented the Chitimacha Tribe at Earth Ambassadors and was a Medicine Man and Healer.

Vorise was preceded in death by his father Arthur Thomas Lightell and Grandmother Elizabeth Teresa Vilcan both of New Orleans, Louisiana.
